



Annual Addicton Medicine Trainings

CME'S & CEU's for Medical Directors and LPHA's

- For DMC-ODS, Medical Directors and LPHA staff, five (5) hours of addiction medicine training must be completed per calendar year.
 - Physicians shall receive a minimum of five (5) hours of continuing medical education (CME) related to addiction medicine each year.
 - Professional staff (LPHA) shall receive a minimum of five (5) hours of continuing education (CEU) related to addiction medicine each year.
- SUD QA are providing support for COR teams monitoring the annual addiction medicine training requirement.
 - A web-based submission form is now available to report trainings.
 - Evidence of training shall be submitted to QI Matters for review to confirm the training meets the requirement.
 - Contract monitors will be reviewing reported trainings regularly and discussing compliance of the annual requirement with programs during annual site visits/desk reviews.
 - Non-compliance may result in corrective action.

What must be submitted?

- Submitted evidence shall include the attendee's name, date of the training, title of the training, and number of hours of CME's or CEU's earned.
- Illegible or incomplete certificates/evidence will be returned.
- Certificates or transcripts lacking CME/CEU information will not be accepted.

Who can report/submit the information?

 Trainings can be reported by the individual who completed the training or on their behalf.





How many trainings can be submitted?

- The submission form will allow for additional certificates to be added with a semicolon. Please ensure you are adding the total number of CME/CEU hours when reporting.
- If you are submitting trainings for multiple staff, you will need to complete one submission form per staff.

Are trainings completed during FY23-24 acceptable?

- DHCS confirmed this requirement is monitored based on calendar year (January-December) vs fiscal year.
- If trainings were complete during the first half of the fiscal year (2023), they will not be accepted for the 2024 review period.

REMINDER:

- Programs are responsible for compliance with this requirement.
- Programs shall monitor compliance by confirming trainings meet the standard for addiction medicine by ensuring trainings offer/provide CME/CEU's with evidence of completion.
- Evidence shall be kept in personnel files and be made available upon request by BHS or DHCS.
