Optum Public Sector, the third party administrator representing San Diego County Behavioral Health Services Mental Health Plan (MHP), received an inquiry regarding accessing behavioral health services in San Diego County. Our network of service providers are trained to determine who may be eligible for Specialty Mental Health Services based on medical necessity criteria for out of county foster youth under a presumptive transfer (AB1299).

<u>For out of county foster youth under presumptive transfer</u> needing to access services in San Diego, any representative on behalf of the beneficiary may utilize the resources below. Upon linking the beneficiary with a provider, necessary person specific information may be directly communicated and exchanged between the San Diego provider and the MHP in the county of original jurisdiction with appropriate releases.
